## **PURPOSE AND SCOPE**

The Leadership Forum was created "to produce committed and involved lawyers willing to take significant leadership roles in local and state bars, and serve as role models in matters of ethics and professionalism."

The Forum's mission has been revised through the years, and is set out as follows:

- To build a cadre of practicing lawyers that understand and appreciate the core values of ethics and professionalism and strive to raise the overall standards of our bar;
- To mold a critical mass of lawyers who will understand and appreciate the concept of servant leadership, and who will be ambassadors for the principles associated with it;
- To form a pool of lawyers who will be leaders both in the state and local bar associations as well as their communities; and
- To change the trajectory of the State of Alabama through active leadership.

The Selection and Program Committee shall evaluate applicants received and select up to 30 members and 4 alternates for admission to Class 15 (2020). The Selection and Program Committee shall complete its work no later than November 21, 2019 and will carry out its work pursuant to the schedule attached as Exhibit 1.

Considerations of the Selection and Program Committee when reviewing applications include, among other factors:

- Demonstrated leadership ability based on past accomplishments and current engagements;
- An understanding of the importance of servant leadership as demonstrated in the applicant's narrative;
- Previous application to the Leadership Forum;
- Practice diversity (criminal, civil, governmental and corporate);
- Geographic diversity including rural and small firm practice representation; and,
- Racial and gender diversity.

Special emphasis will be placed upon the first two criteria. The Selection and Program Committee shall be prepared to devote a considerable amount of time to this selection process during the 30 day period described in Exhibit 1.

In addition, the Selection and Program Committee will also work with the Alabama State Bar staff to assist in planning and coordinating programming and social events for Leadership Forum Class 15. The Alabama State Bar, through its designated staff liaisons, will assist the committee in carrying out its purpose.
