WHEREAS, Harold remained at Birmingham-Southern College until 1942, when he answered his nation's call to service in wake of the attack on Pearl Harbor; and

WHEREAS, throughout World War II, Harold served as a torpedoman in the pacific theatre of war on two separate destroyers, the USS Wilson and the USS Gregory; and

WHEREAS, Harold received a Purple Heart after surviving a Kamikaze attack off the coast of Okinawa, Japan while serving on the USS Gregory; and

WHEREAS, at the conclusion of World War II, Harold enrolled in the University of Alabama's law program; and

WHEREAS, Harold completed his Juris Doctorate in 1949, and then was commissioned into the U.S. Air Force as a Staff Judge Advocate, reaching the rank of Colonel; and

WHEREAS, having been in practice for almost 70 consecutive years, Harold is one of the longest practicing attorneys in the state of Alabama; and

WHEREAS, Harold has devoted his life to spreading the gospel and helping others and has played an instrumental role in starting churches in New Mexico, Japan and Prattville; and

WHEREAS, Harold's greatest accomplishment is his loving family, which includes five children, 12 grandchildren and 23 great-grandchildren;
