

With easy-to-navigate prompts, a user should be able to find courthouse information, an attorney directory searchable by location and practice area, information about the Volunteer Lawyers Program, Legal Services Alabama, the Lawyer Referral Service, Free Legal Answers, self-help court forms, and many other resources.

FINANCIAL REPORT The ASB finance director Sections 3% and financial assistant work cohesively with the officers Appropriation and staff to maintain accountability over numerous fund accounts and related activities in the custody of the Alabama State Bar. From July 1 to June 30, the finance department processed disbursements and receipts for the ASB and its closely related

foundation entities, totaling approximately \$9 million and

\$9.2 million, respectively; coordinated with the Regions investment group to monitor \$18.9 million of invested funds; provided fundamental reporting to keep stakeholders informed of the ASB's financial performance and to meet the tax and other financial reporting deadlines required by state and federal guidelines; handled all travel pre-approvals and reimbursements for the agency; formulated and submitted the annual state budget appropriation, as approved by the board of bar commissioners; and compiled all required documents for examinations/audits performed by the Examiner of Public Accounts and external auditors.
